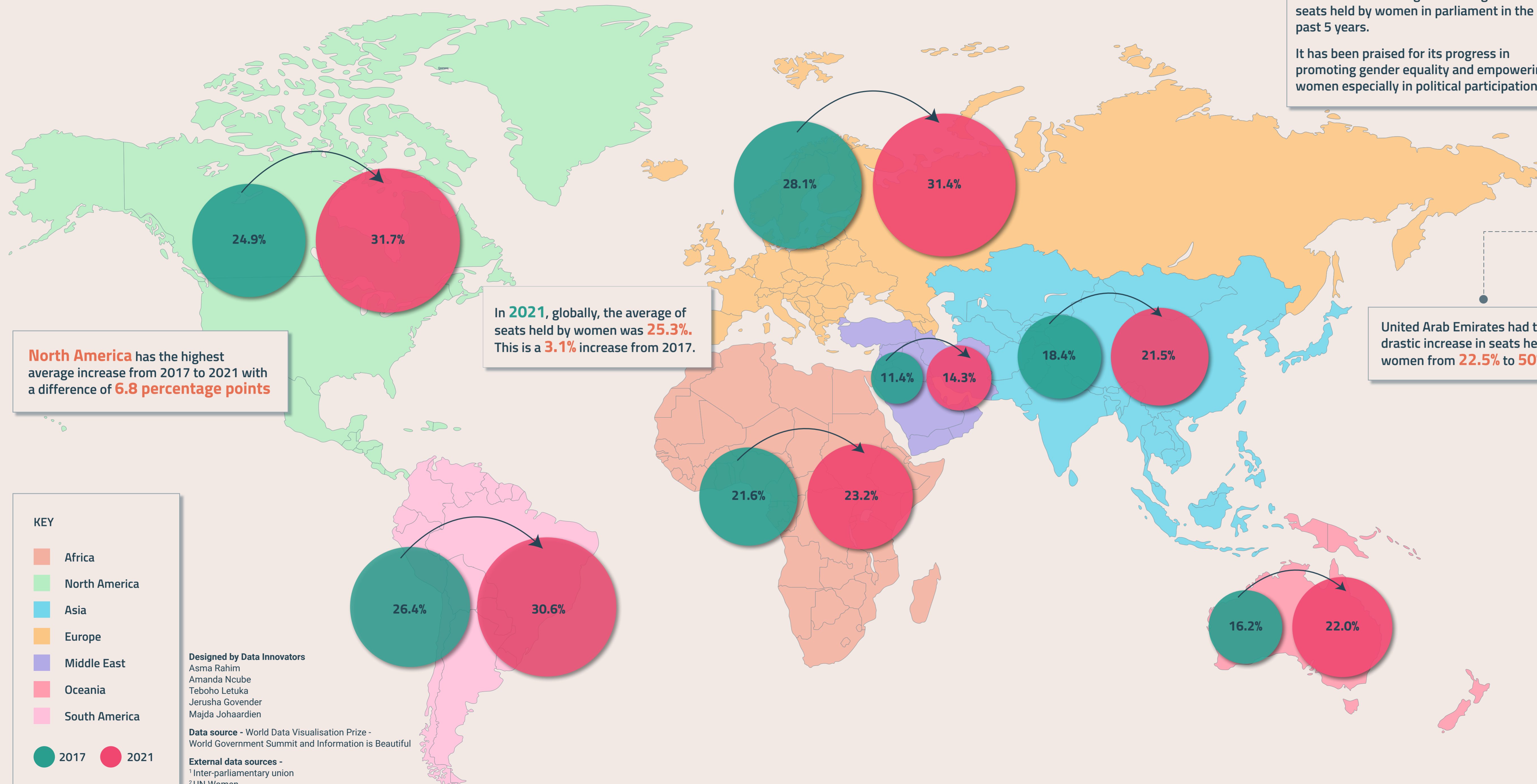


Women in Parliament - A snapshot of the last 5 years

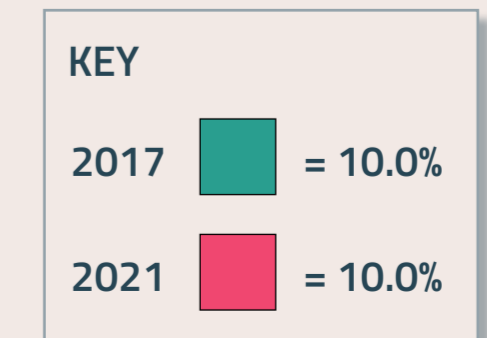
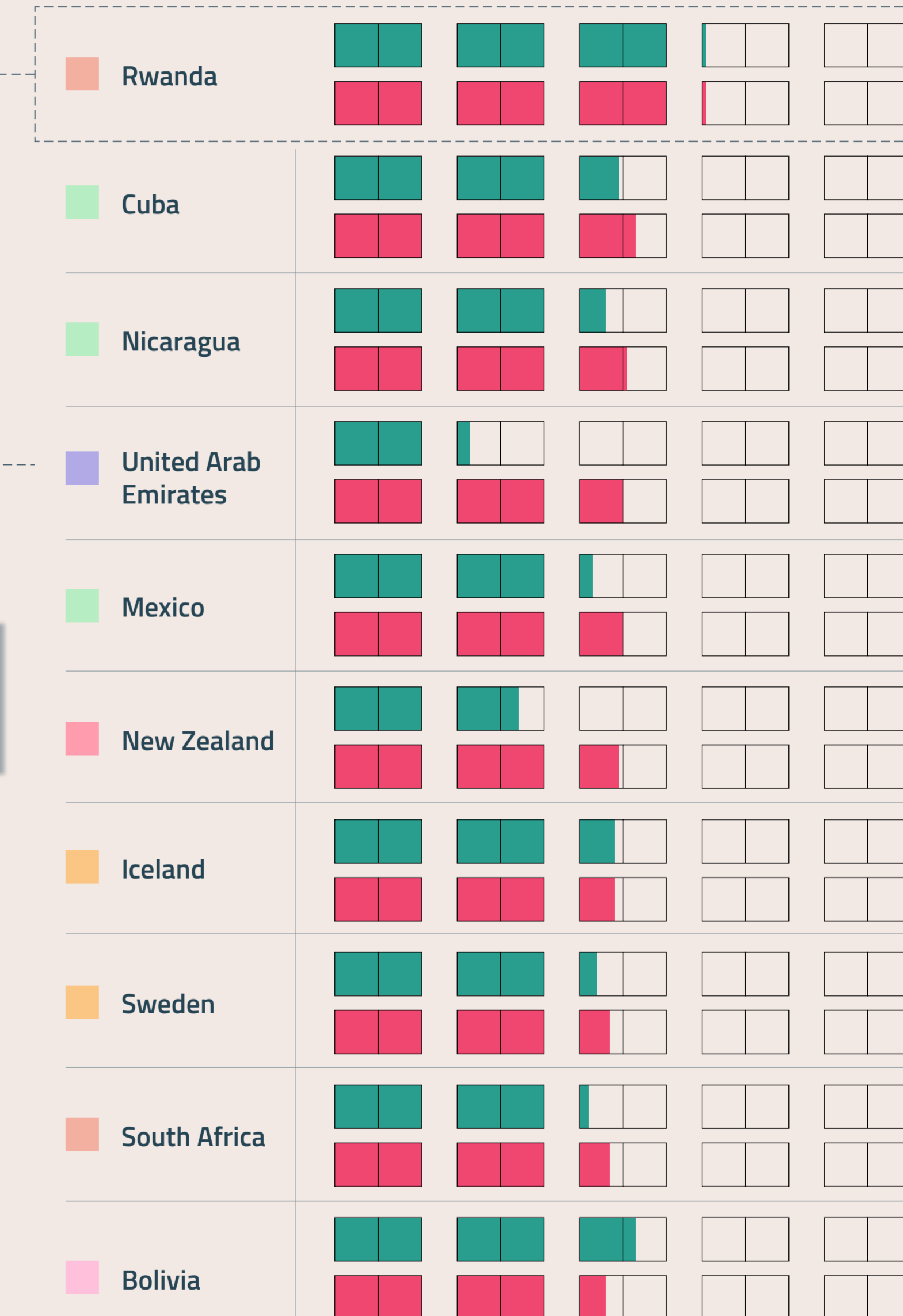
Although there is a growing number of women being elected to parliaments globally, true equality remains distant, and the current pace of progress is unsatisfactorily slow. The majority of parliaments still have a disproportionate representation.¹ This is a data viz showing the regional representation of the average(%) seats held by women in parliament in the last 5 years (2017-2021).

North American countries feature the most in the top 10 list of seats held by women in parliament. Cuba is the country that is second on the list with 53.4%. Asia does not feature in this list.
